#### 8:15 - 12:15 Pre-Conference A Fundamental Skills IUD Training

Practicum participants will receive background information and learn placement techniques for the five intrauterine devices currently available: Mirena®, ParaGard®, Skyla®, Liletta® and Kyleena®. Hands-on practice will be supervised by experienced preceptors.

#### 9:30 - 12:30 Pre-Conference B Nexplanon® Placement + Removal

Practicum participants will learn how to identify appropriate Nexplanon<sup>™</sup> (etonogestrel implant) patients, prepare patients for placement, and manage technical issues related to placing the contraceptive device. Participants will also receive hands-on, supervised instruction on the latest techniques for placement, localization, removal and re-insertion using an artificial model.

This practicum session, sponsored by Merck, is not accredited for continuing education credit and is only open to doctors or advanced practice clinicians with furnishing or prescribing privileges in their state. It is Merck policy to verify participant practice, licensure and eligibility information in advance of the conference date. Merck will contact participants directly if there is a problem regarding this process. Certificates of completion will only be issued to participants that are present for the entire training session.

#### 1:30 - 4:30 Pre-Conference C Advanced Skills IUD Training

Practicum participants will learn skills for mastering challenging IUD placements and removals. Techniques will be reviewed for the safe use of the tenaculum, uterine sound, and inserters. Tips for avoiding common IUD placement pitfalls will be provided. Participants will practice techniques for managing cervical stenosis, providing adequate pain relief during and after placement, removing IUDs without strings and preventing vasovagal syncope and uterine perforation.

1:30 - 4:30 Pre-Conference D Nexplanon® Placement + Removal (Repeated)

1:30 - 4:30 Pre-Conference E Asking the Right Questions: Leveraging the PATH Framework to C Support Reproductive Autonomy

Practicum participants will learn the PATH framework – a concrete, patient-centered set of questions and counseling skills designed to effectively engage with patients to identify their reproductive life goals and how they can work toward achieving them. The PATH questions are non-judgmental and open-ended. The framework is focused on effectively inviting the patient to explore their values and preferences, and moving the conversation forward to offer the services and information that are best aligned with the preferences identified.
